Review of June, 2023 Minutes

Principal Update

- health & safety update
 - Huron Perth Public Health have not put any measures in place at this time
 - fountains will remain turned off and unlikely to be turned back on so all students strongly encouraged to bring a water bottle; cups will be available if parents unable to bring any forgotten water bottles to school
 - Elly will contact OCWA to determine if water bottle donations may be a possibility
 - extra-curricular activities, field trips, hot lunch programs being held this year
- Lake Huron Family of Parishes update
 - monthly school wide Masses will continue to be held Friday afternoons at 12:45pm
 - updates will continue to be included in week at a glance including information about sacramental preparations

- Fr Tony has scheduled bi-monthly class visits
- **HPCDSB** policy reviews
 - Policy 3B:5 Information and Communications Technology
 - Policy 3D:9 Student Dress Code _
- mental health supports
 - contract renewed with Huron Perth Centre to provide 1 full day/week of support from counselor Julie Webster; this will be her sixth year with us
 - can also access supports from other community partners including Huron Perth Public Health, Mental Health and Addiction Nurses, Rural Response, Choices for Change, Big Brothers Big Sisters
- technology update
 - students will receive his/her own Chromebook
 - students in grade 6/7 and 7/8 classes take devices home each night for charging
 - students have been very respectful in new cell phone collection procedure _
- Safe and Healthy School Team will again be formed this year and will be composed of students, teacher, principal, support staff member; Amy Wilhelm will again serve as parent/community member
 - advise the principal on strategies that will help achieve the goals of inclusive education, bullying prevention, and positive mental health and well-being of all students
 - help to plan assemblies, guest speakers, programs offered by community partners such as those offered by Huron Perth Public Health

- last year
 - Greyhaven Gardens total raised \$1057
 - Christmas fundraiser raised \$641
 - Spring fundraiser raised \$416
 - Chocolate Factory fundraiser raised \$1232
 - \$2289 total annual funds raised
- Chocolate Factory Christmas and Easter fundraisers
 - could bundle family orders and pick up from church hall
 - Amy will find out pricing

- Amy will gather some info from various greenhouses for Christmas/Spring fundraiser
 - Jayme will also explore options

Possible Fundraisers

- \$700 pizza for Open House -
